

I was honored to officiate the funeral service for a good friend, **George Motzer**, last month. While George faced many challenges in his life, he never threw a pity party. Instead, he just loved to party. He loved eating and talking. He was quick with a joke. He loved to smile and bring a smile to others' faces. In his written directions for the funeral director, George requested that he have a smile on his face, if possible.

George was never married. However, he had a HUGE family. We (his church) were his family. We looked out for him, cared for him, laughed with him, fought with him, and cried with him. Dolores called him every morning at 10 AM for a morning devotion. Clyde, Donna, Jim, and JoEllen drove him to church every weekend. George was a very active part of our church's life, including mine. At least once a week, I received a wellness call from George, who always ended his calls with the words, "God loves you and so do I.".

George never had biological children. However, he financially supported a youth pastor who was going through seminary. George always supported our youth mission teams whenever they were raising funds for their trips. One young adult told me that (every year,) George would give him a \$50 bill and say (with a smile,) "Now, I'm giving you a \$5 bill, right?"

When you think of George, I hope you'll remember George for more than his visual limitations. I hope you'll remember his many God-given talents. One gift was a sharp mind that could remember dozens of names and phone numbers. (I can barely remember what I had for breakfast.) Another is the gift of encouragement. When Covid isolated us, George (who already had a ministry of encouraging people) ramped up his efforts to connect with and encourage others. A third gift is George's faith, which served as the bedrock for George's life.

Friendship was one of George's greatest gifts. George genuinely cared for people. He treasured his friendships and went out of his way to be a good friend. One of my lasting memories of George is how much he loved his medical doctor - Dr. Robert Manoogian. When Dr. Manoogian died, George grieved deeply because Dr. Manoogian was more than just a medical doctor. Dr. Manoogian was George's friend. In fact, as many of you know, George handed Dr. Manoogian adoption papers and announced that they were brothers, and he meant it. Praise God for the wonderful life of George Motzer - a good Christian man - a brother and friend to many, including me.

(Note: George's body is buried at Mount Vernon Cemetery (Lemont). He's in the "Last Supper 3" section. When his headstone is installed, I'll offer another update.)

Family Ministries

Whew! What an amazing 3 days of our Youth Mission Trip. This year we stayed local, worked with 2 of our mission partners and had a work day at the church. Over the course of 3 days, 37 people joined us for a total of 296 hours of work!!

The week began at The Bridge Teen Center in Orland Park. We sorted through 37 bags of donated clothing. Clothing is either kept for sale at the thrift store or recycled. Clothing is sorted according to type and size then loaded onto racks to be sold in the store. 37 bags of clothing will bring in enough money to support free programming for 2 teens for an entire year! That's over 300 opportunities for teens to participate for free! The Bridge offers classes such as goat yoga, welding, cooking with local restaurant chefs, art, guitar classes, karaoke, basic car maintenance and 100's more.



Fourteen people joined us for the work day at Faith UMC. Many projects were completed to help beautify and clean the church. Some of the work included: floors scrubbed and cleaned. Pews cleaned and polished. Tables deep cleaned and sanitized. Doors and woodwork cleaned and conditioned. Windows and windowsills cleaned. Food pantry cleaned and organized. The church is looking clean and beautiful!!

The final day of the Mission Trip was spent at Hands, Hooves and Hope Ranch in Manhattan. HHH Ranch is owned and operated by Faith's own Matt and Christine Beechler. The ranch is a non-for-profit ranch that currently has 40 chickens, a goat, a llama, ponies, donkeys, horses and cows as residents. Matt and Christine have chosen to make the ranch accessible to all. They offer therapeutic riding lessons for kids with special needs. They open the ranch on weekends for families to enjoy for free. Children and families can interact with the animals and even paint a horse. Our work at the ranch consisted of sorting and moving wood, removing hardware and nails from wood (an effort to reuse the wood for other projects), shoveling and spreading mulch in animal enclosures, clearing out weeds from horse arena, watering and feeding animals, cleaning water and feeding bowls/troughs, cleaning out barn.

The Youth at Faith UMC are hard-working and dedicated! They have a heart for service and worked diligently to serve others during our mission trip week. We are so proud of each of them for donating their time to bring kindness, love and beauty to others.



HELP WANTED: We are busy preparing for the start of Sunday school and upcoming children and youth activities. We have big plans! But...we can't do it without your help. We are currently in need of Sunday school teachers and general volunteers for children's programs. Our volunteer pool has decreased greatly in the past two years. 


