**Advent & Christmas** 

Advent is the season of waiting. The word "advent" derives from the Latin "adventus," which means "coming." Advent the season of preparation for the celebration of Jesus' birth. It's also the season of anticipation for Jesus' second coming – when Christ will come to judge the living and the dead.

So, what's the difference between Advent and Christmas? Lester Ruth, a professor at Duke Divinity School and a historian of Christian worship, offers this distinction: "The simplest way I have to distinguish between Advent and Christmas is that Advent uses the word 'come' as a longing petition, expressed in anticipation, whereas Christmas is a commemorative reflection on how the Lord has come in Christ's birth and thus the trigger for a new redemptive order has begun."

As we journey through this Advent season, I hope you'll make WORSHIP a priority. You can join us for worship in-person or online. You can also worship on your own or with family & friends. While the temptation during this season is to speed up, let's take time during this holy season to slow down, worship God, and reflect on God's greatest gift of all.

#### Christmas & New Year

Here's the worship schedule for Christmas and New Year.

On Saturday, December 24, we'll offer 3 worship services @ 4 PM, 7 PM, and 11 PM.

The 4 PM service is an interactive and shorter service designed with children in mind.

The 7 & 11 PM services are more traditional in design and feature music by the Faith Rising Band (7 PM) and Chancel Choir (11 PM). All 3 services will include carols, communion, and candles: (note: Nursery care will be offered at the 7 PM Christmas Eve.

On Sunday, December 25, we'll gather @ 10 AM for a Service of Lessons & Carols. We'll celebrate Christmas by reading Scriptures and singing Christmas Carols.

On Sunday, January 1, we'll gather @ 10 AM for a Wesleyan Covenant Service. This is a time to remember our baptism and renew our covenant as disciples of Jesus Christ. There are no other worship services this weekend.

On Saturday/Sunday, January 7-8, we'll resume our regular worship times (Sat @ 4 PM and Sun @ 9 & 11 AM) with our New Year's sermon series, "Soul Reset." Based on the book study by Rev. Junius Dotson, this series will invite everyone moving through life at breakneck speed to slow down and do a hard "reboot" of our spiritual lives. This sermon series will be accompanied by a ZOOM small group on Sunday nights @ 7 PM. If you're interested in being part of this discussion group, contact me (pastorcaleb@faithumcop.org).

Men of Faith Recognition Weekend:






