Lent / Holy Week / Easter

There's a lot that can happen in 40 days – bodies can be renewed, spirits can be rejuvenated, relationships can be reconciled, hearts can be mended. Biblically speaking, 40 days represents a season of change and renewal. It marks the close of one chapter and the start of another. I hope this season of Lent has served as a time of refreshing and renewal for your body and soul.

Soren Kierkegaard reminds us that Jesus called people to be his "followers" not admirers. Jesus never asked for admirers, worshippers, nor adherents. Jesus called people to follow him. Therefore, Christians are not merely those who admire / study Jesus' teaching (with our heads), we're people who trust and follow him (with our lives). In these remaining days of Lent, let's reflect on God's love for us and embrace Christ's life – his teaching, his ministry, his suffering, even his death. In doing so, we can embrace the miracle of resurrection for ourselves today.

Here's a list of the Holy Week worship opportunities:

Palm Sunday (April 1-2) – We'll wave palms and join the crowds in praising God and welcoming Christ into Jerusalem. Faith's Chancel Choir will sing their Easter Cantata @ 9 AM. We'll even have a special guest appearance by Bumble (the miniature horse) on Sunday @ 9 & 11 AM.

Maundy Thursday (April 6 @ 7:00 PM) – Our drama team will offer a contemporary version of the Last Supper. We'll share holy communion.

Good Friday (April 7 @ 7:00 PM) – We'll experience the extinguishing of the Light as we recite the scriptures and sing the hymns describing Christ's suffering, condemnation, and death on the cross.

Holy Saturday (April 8, 10 AM - Noon) Confirmands will lead us in prayer and meditation around Christ's death and sacrifice for us. Note: the location of the Prayer Stations is at Palos UMC (12101 S. Harlem Ave, Palos Heights).

Easter (April 8-9) – We'll celebrate the mystery and wonder of the resurrection in 4 worship services: Saturday @ 4:00 PM, Sunday @ 7:00, 9:00, and 11:00 AM. Note: Sunday @ 7 AM is a sunrise service in the church parking lot.

Bright Sunday / Easter Sermon Series

On **Bright Sunday** (April 15-16), we continue our Easter celebration with a special weekend of worship centered around "*The Gospel According to Toy Story*." Join us for worship this weekend with your favorite "*Toy Story*" toys and/or clothes as we learn important lessons about faith and friendship.

After **Bright Sunday**, we will start a sermon series focused on the question, "Who is Jesus?" In this series, we'll wrestle with the claims and controversies around the most influential person in history – Jesus. One of the writers I'll refer to is John Ortberg, who offered this introduction in his book, "Who is This Man?"

"On the day after Jesus' death, it looked as if whatever small mark he left on the world would rapidly disappear. Instead, his impact on human history has been unparalleled. After his disappearance from earth, the days of his unusual influence began... Rightly seen, this effect on past and current history will cause any thoughtful person – apart from their religious ideas about Christianity – to ask, "Who was this man?"

Another relationship we've nurtured is with *Bethshan* – a local faith-based organization that cares for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. For several years, we've had the residents of two group homes join us for worship services. The residents of one home *(Orchid House)* became members of Faith in 2022. In 2023, we were invited to lead quarterly worship services for residents at the main Bethshan facility in Palos Heights. 
