

It was the spring of 2010 when I last received a "new appointment" call from the District Superintendent. For 5 years, I served as the pastor of a 2-point charge at Oregon UMC/Lighthouse UMC. Now, I was invited to serve as the lead pastor of a recently merged church – Faith UMC of Orland Park.

As soon as I heard the history and met Faith's leadership team, I knew I was entering into a positive ministry position. Sure, there was anxiety, but there was more excitement than anxiety. Sure, there was fear, but there was more faith than fear. While there were concerns about moving into the future with new pastors, there was hope and excitement for new ministries, new directions, new leadership.

The two pastors before me (Rev. Ted Jones & Rev. Bob Haight) ensured a smooth pastoral transition. Faith had strong lay leaders in place. We had a strong staff team. I was welcomed graciously by our congregation, who knew nothing about me, but trusted God. Receiving me as Faith's new pastor was just another step of faith in the journey.

Every morning, I thank God for the new day, for new opportunities, and the amazing people in my life. For 13 years, I have been privileged to walk with you, run with you, laugh with you, cry with you, and even stumble/get back up with you. I have been part of weddings, baptisms, birthday parties, graduations, and funerals with you. Together, we have served our community – locally and internationally – to the best of our ability. It has been an amazing (and fun) ride.

Now, it's time for another transition – for you and for me. I spent 13 years as an associate/ youth pastor in Delaware, Georgia, and Illinois. I spent 13 years as the lead pastor of Faith UMC of Orland Park. Now, as I prepare to serve as the lead pastor of Christ United Methodist Church in Rockford, IL, (possibly for the next 13 years,) Faith is preparing to receive a new lead pastor. While the future is unknown, I am excited for this next chapter in Faith's ministry story.

The good news – Faith is a strong and healthy congregation. Yes, we have our share of squabbles. Yes, we have plenty of room for improvement and growth. However, we are a congregation full of servant-leaders, who love God and love people. We have a generous and gracious congregation that shines a positive light in the community. We have a kind and compassionate congregation who embraces people in their most difficult seasons. We have faithful and welcoming congregation that has received and nurtured many pastors,

including me. Faith is a strong and healthy congregation that God has used to bless our community long before I arrived. Faith will be this kind of congregation long after I leave.

So, please keep your eyes focused on the mission. Don't be discouraged and distracted. Yes, there will be changes. Yes, things will not be the same as before. Change is never easy. However, our purpose has not changed. We are still called to follow Jesus and make disciples.

We are still called to love God and our neighbor as ourselves. Our mission remains the same – to be a church family "that brings people to Jesus Christ through worship, education, mission, and fellowship."

As I write this article, I do not know who will be appointed as Faith's next pastor. However, I am confident that God will send someone whose gifts and talents will bless you and our community in surprising and unexpected ways. I am also sure that you will continue to be a congregation that receives and nurtures this new pastoral leader. So, please stay focused on the mission and continue to serve. If you're scheduled to finish your leadership term, I ask you to offer an additional year. Don't shy away from ministry opportunities. Don't say "no" when the new pastor asks you to serve. Give time and space for them to grow, just as you offered the same time and room to me. Let's continue to honor the Lord's work in us and through us.



As for me, I will do my best to maintain healthy boundaries so that the new pastor can transition without distractions from the predecessor. Certainly, I will look and listen for updates on what's happening at Faith, but I will not intervene. I will not return for weddings and funerals and other milestone events. I will not offer my two cents – even when I'm tempted to jump in. Instead, I will be watching and praying and cheering you on from a distance – no longer as your pastor, but as an admirer, brother, and friend.

Thank you for the privilege of walking with you as your pastor.



This month the Safety team re-affirmed our commitment to a nut free "Taste of Faith." Being a newcomer to Faith, I find myself learning about new policies and procedures that go along with the experience here. In my short time here, I have found the community to be extremely friendly and kind, conscious of others, and welcoming to new people. When I heard that Taste of Faith was a nut free time, I was not surprised. In my 15 years in Youth Ministry I have encountered many children and adults with nut allergies, and know that seeing an allergic reaction is a terrifying event. My own personal policy in ministry has always been to never serve nuts. This policy can feel extreme at times, especially because peanut butter is my second favorite food after chocolate, but the risk is too high, and I know that I like healthy kids more than I like pecans. I know that there is loss in committing to being completely nut free, like not being able to cook for others and sometimes having repetitive store-bought snacks, but food prepared in non-nut free environments is just too big of a risk during a time that we have committed to being welcoming for everyone, especially for our most vulnerable population, our children. Thank you for continuing to commit to this and for loving our children in the small but important way of keeping them safe.

KidCheck is a secure children's check-in system that enhances your provider's security system and simplifies the check-in process. KidCheck helps ensure no one can pick up your child without your consent. **More information about KidCheck can be found at www.kidcheck.com.**


